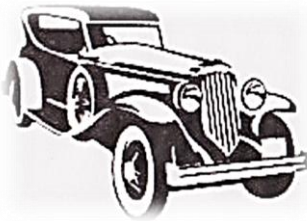

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For More than 30 Years, TAC has Set the Authentication Standard

The “TAC Program” is a generic name for the STOA standing committee called the Tiger Authentication Committee (TAC). It was formed in the early 90’s to attempt to stop the conversion of Sunbeam chassis originally sold as Alpines being misrepresented as Tigers.

In all honesty, I guess I am the primary culprit that pushed this activity into a going club-sponsored activity. I believe it was 1991 at Napa that one of our most active members damaged her speedo cable putting her Tiger on her trailer. I had built her a new front suspension which was installed by other local club members at her home. She was having alignment problems and asked me after the event to check out the front crossmember. At my home, I pulled the crossmember and discovered that the curing heat for powder coat was enough to distort what I thought was the final location of crossmember. In any case I hydraulically adjusted the upper A-arm mounts and reinstalled the crossmember. She asked if I would install a new Speedo cable to replace the damaged one. No problem as it was on my hoist. So, I went with my normal tools to remove the retaining bolt for the cable on the transmission tailhousing. To my surprise there was a sheet of steel covering the direct access to this bolt. I looked around under the chassis and it was obviously not a Tiger chassis. At this point I came out from under her “Tiger” and without thinking said “This isn’t a Tiger, it’s a conversion”. As soon as the words came out, I was ever so sorry. The effect was such that I was worried about how she took the shock of my statement. Let’s say she reacted physically and calling 911 was a real possibility.

After thinking about this for a few days, I decided that this situation was out of control and something had to be done. Unknown Algers floating around for sale everywhere was bound to severely impact the value of real “factory built” Tigers. I began discussion with other active members and the conclusion was that “something” had to be done. We formed the TAC subcommittee and began to discuss what could be done. Since STOA was and remains a “Tiger” club, we collectively decided that STOA should lead this effort. There was only room in our limited market for one club to lead this effort. Now although this may have been my “idea”, I’m simply the one who lit the fuse. It took off and many members of STOA are responsible for the numerous meetings, discussions of criteria, methodology, and legal queries to avoid potential lawsuits, and develop the documentation took place. Norman Miller, Paul Reisentz, Mike Andres were a big part of our team. It took about a year and half to pull this project together. We knew that lots of “not invented here” and other interclub problems would occur, and we planned for these situations. Pat King has been the TAC Committee Chairman for most of its duration.

So, we started out, first in the SF bay area doing TAC events including taking the program on the road on weekends to local owners. We have to thank Rick McLeod for supplying owners’ addresses. Then we took the program to the LA area and Paul Reisentz leaned on his old friends and the program took wings. Our first outing to a TE/AE meet was in Florida and we held our own. In fact, it’s the reception our authentication program has had with other clubs that has made it so successful. The “not invented here” argument was rare and the support of long time Tiger owners who belonged to other Tiger/Alpine Clubs was welcome news. By becoming a Senior Inspector for the region you live in, allowed the program to expand quickly. Buck Trippel and Jere Teeppen in LA, Tom Calvert in the DC area, Paul Sheahan in south Florida, Larry Atkisson in the greater Washington area, Peter Thomson and Hobey Landreth In Australia, Doug Babcock in Oregon, Rob Roy in Texas, Bill Bulpitt in Georgia, John Stein in Colorado, Graham Vickery and Andy Carter in the UK, and recently Lynn Wall in Utah, and Brian Faerge in western Canada. They’ve all done their share and more in building the TAC Program into what it is today.

Turning down authentication requests of Tigers for well-respected members is not popular, and I have to say, since that time, every one of them I know of has since found an authenticated Tiger for their collection. We took the program on the road world-wide including Australia and the UK, which is still our toughest market. Since early on, I have successfully managed to escape the title of TAC chairman, preferring to work behind the scenes as Senior Inspector #1, and keeper of the digital data. Trips to the UK with Buck Trippel managed to locate factory drawings which proved beyond a shadow of a doubt that our “secrets” in determining the differences between the Tiger and the Alpine chassis were accurate and well founded.

It's important to note that the goal is to find evidence that the car originated with Pressed Steel, Rootes and Jensen. We don't make determinations that a car is NOT a Tiger, rather that there is not enough evidence to conclude that it is. Owners may submit additional evidence for further consideration. A car need not be complete for a TAC inspection. We make every effort to treat owners with respect and privacy. Whenever possible, we recommend a new purchase be TACd before investing significant time and expense in restoration. In case a TAC certificate is lost or damaged, replacements are available. At this point STOA has been pushing this program for 32 years. I and the tother 14 Senior Inspectors have collectively trained 121 regular Inspectors across the globe. This is how we opened up the availability of Authentication to new locations. Our latest count shows 1491 Certificates issued. All in all, we consider it a very successful contribution to the value of our favorite Marque. And it's by no means over. We are still waiting for the UK to come around and owners to understand the value of the TAC Certificate. It's a tough market over there, but it will come around. When you get to the point where the first question from a prospective Tiger buyer is “where's the TAC Certificate”, you know you've made a significant difference.

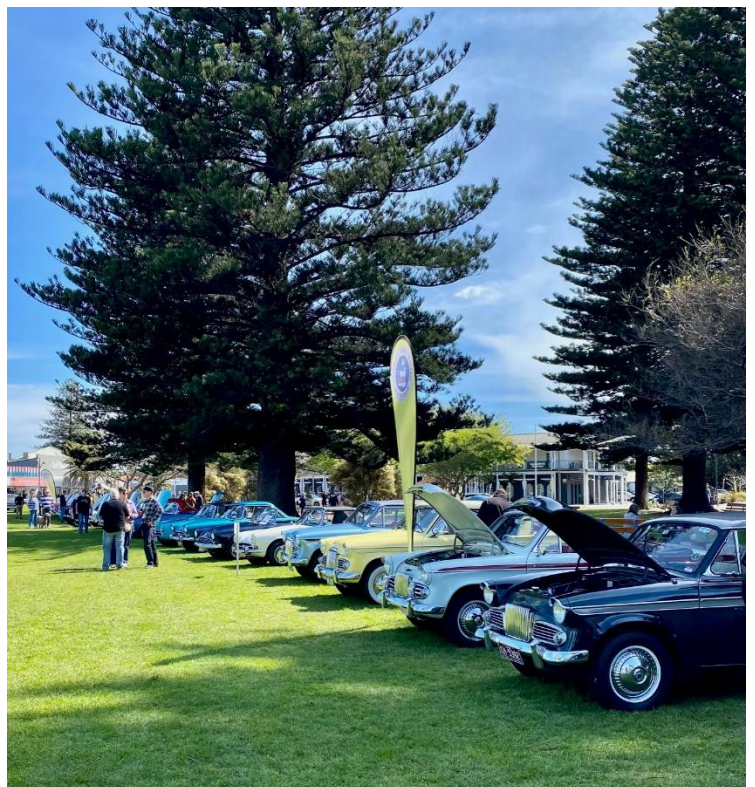
The 2025 Sunbeam Nationals offered up a list of events and activities quite familiar to participants -- dinners, show and shine, tour, awards -- all expertly organized and executed by the South Australia Sunbeam Car Club. And Victor Harbor as a location did not disappoint. That is, until Monday when it was time to depart, at which time the wind kicked up and blew us all out of town. But more on that later



Saturday's car show on the village green was a stunning display. Locals mingled with owners, and snapped photos in perfect weather. On Sunday it was time to drive to the Gilbert Motor Museum in Strathalbyn, and the event organizers left it to the participants to choose their own route. The options were many. I suggested that the three Victorians without co-drivers (Michael Eurey, Graham Gilbert, and myself) travel as a caravan of 'lone wolves'. Would this reduce the chances of navigational error? Well, no. But it sounded like fun, and it was.

We picked up a fourth Sunbeam as we left Victor Harbor, and with me leading us along, we jumped off the main road onto Deep Creek, which winds its way towards Bull Creek Road and Ashbourne. It was instantly lovely. Remote, beautiful, empty of other cars. And unpaved. This would be the second time in my short tenure with the SCCV that I have led a tour onto a dirt road, the first being our short-lived bouncing experience on the Adair Track at Mount Tarrengower. And now I'd done it again. But this time, thankfully, the road was very smooth, and after a quick pull over and consultation, all four of us continued on. It turned out to be very much worth a bit of dust, as the isolated meandering amongst verdant pastures in a tucked away valley was spectacular.

A few kilometres later we re-joined pavement and winged our way up and over a ridgeline into Strathalbyn. The Gilbert Motor Museum is a fantastic collection, and very well organized. Well worth the visit if you find yourself in town.





The weekend concluded with the awards dinner Sunday night. But for interested parties, specifically Tiger owners, Andy Ford had organized the viewing of a recently produced film “Two Smoking Tigers” at the local art deco theatre in town. Tigers lined Ocean Street in front of the theatre, and the audience viewed the amazing footage and interviews of an array of Tiger history experts.

Following the film, it was time to launch for home, or for some, further touring destinations on the way home. The wind had begun blasting Victor Harbor with a vengeance. As I transited northbound through the nearby farms, gusts rolled in with authority, sending top soil flying horizontally and dictating a lane dance. My wipers started moving, and I hadn’t turned them on. I opened both rear quarter windows on the hardtop to help with air flow. Thankfully the wind abated once I’d put a hundred or so kilometres in my rear view mirror, and the Tiger and I settled down to the task at hand. As it was with the rest of the SCCV contingent, I arrived home intact and on schedule.

Events such as these always create memories that last, and the 2025 Nationals in Victor Harbor was no exception.

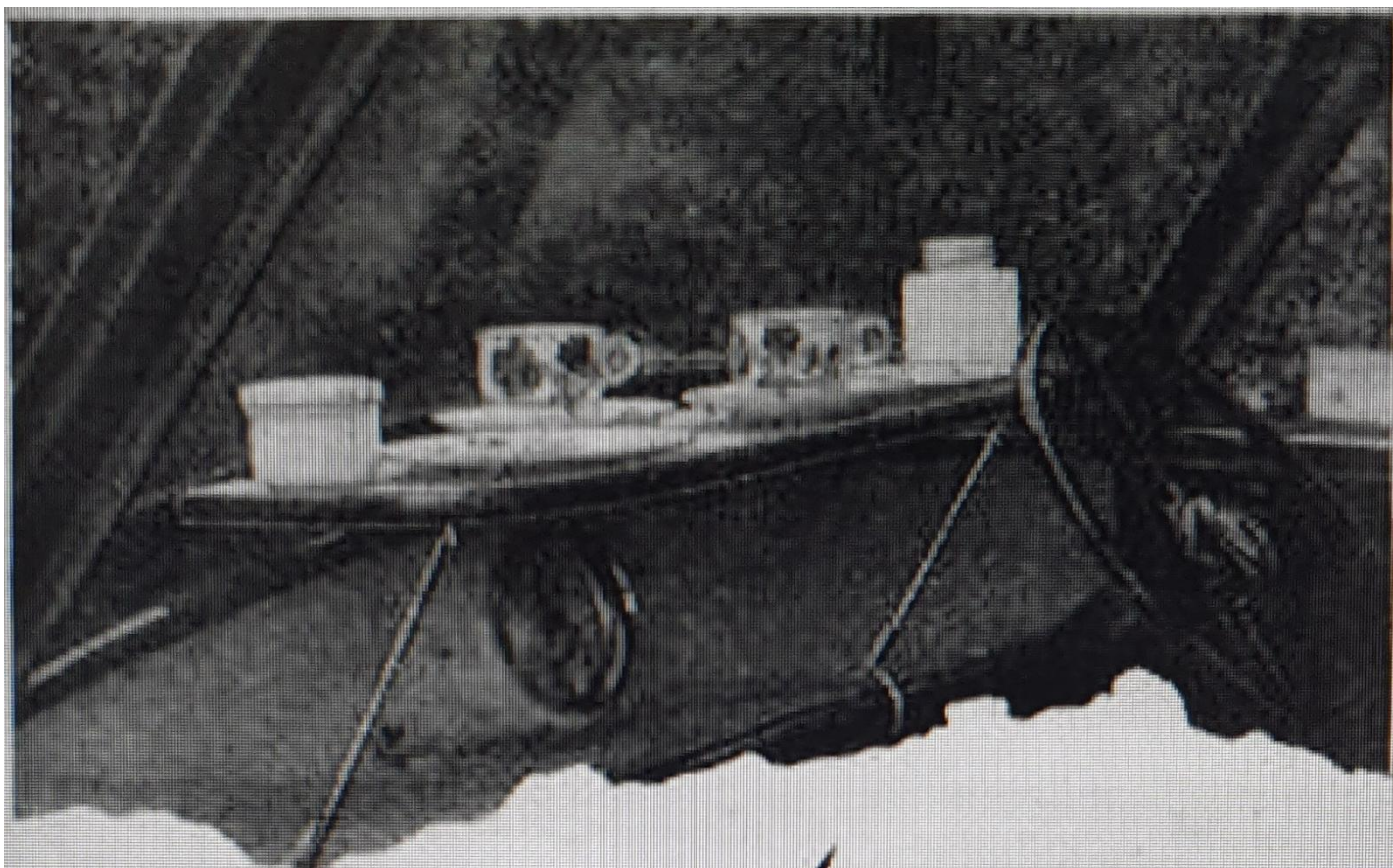

RENEWAL OF YOUR CLUB PERMIT

- 1. Immediately you receive the VicRoads Club Permit Renewal Form,** check the expiry date is correct. If it is not correct contact VicRoads.

If you have not received a renewal form at least 2 weeks prior to the date the permit expires, contact VicRoads and request the required CPS renewal form, including a new logbook.

- 2. CONTACT the Club Permit Officer** to sign the Club Permit Renewal Form.

The CPS Renewal Form will be signed, copied & sent back to you within 7 days.

PAYMENT of the required fee can be made at a VicRoads office

OR paid via a VicRoads online account

Note your CPS cars must be listed on your VicRoads online account
Print the payment receipt which should be kept with your logbook.

- 3. PLEASE NOTE** that if the fee for the renewal is not received by VicRoads prior to the expiry date, the car must not be driven on a public road until the fee have been paid and a VicRoads receipt has been issued.

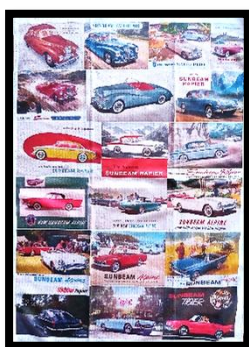

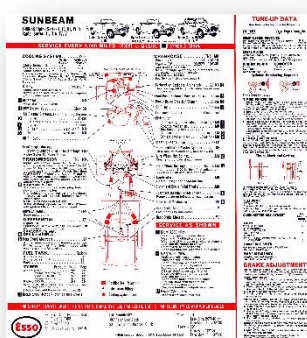

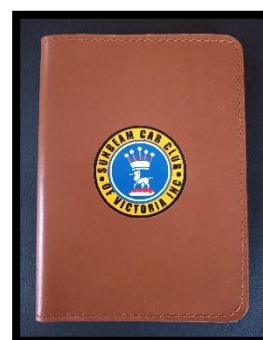
